

When the Anti-Doping Rule Violation involves test results of a sample, JADCO is not able to speak on that matter until after a 'B' sample has been returned by JADCO, showing a positive result of a banned substance. However, the athlete is to be informed first, then his or her sport organisation and the public can only be notified after the case has been submitted to the Independent Anti-Doping Disciplinary Panel. Even at that point, details of the allegations cannot be disclosed by law, unless the athlete breaches the protocol, or gives permission for disclosure.

It should be pointed out that JADCO has no control over the hearing procedure before the Independent Anti-Doping Disciplinary Panel, but the Panel may request certain documents and advise of the persons it wishes to take part in any hearing, including interested sports organisations.
